Psychiatric services are offered at Royal Treatment by LaShonda Ferguson, PMHNP and Barbara Bargo, PMHNP and crisis services are referred to Trillium Center located at the Baptist Regional Medical Center in Corbin, KY and St. Joe's Hospital in London, KY. Our direct care staff accompanies the residents to all psychiatric appointments. Our therapists maintain contact with the providers on a regular basis in order to collaborate on all residents' progress and occasionally accompany the residents to their psychiatric appointments.
