The Bair Foundation seeks consultation from a Psychiatrist in the community. If recommended, the child should be seen by the Psychiatrist within 30 days of admission. Mental Health Services will be provided weekly or more frequent as needed by a therapist or Treatment Director on staff. The services will be overseen by The Bair Foundation and regular documentation of psychiatric appointments will be documented in each child's record. The DCBS case worker will be made aware of any medications that are prescribed with appropriate notice.
