Benchmark Family Services provides quality services including therapeutic case management services, 24 hour crisis intervention, and mental health treatment with a contracted psychiatrist and on staff therapists. Our goal is to provide stable and consistent placements to youth in care and will work with DCBS to prevent disruptions or unnecessary moves for children in care. Case managers provide detailed monthly Treatment Status Reports to the referring agency and include the referring agency in all treatment planning meetings. Each youth placed will complete a thorough pycho-social assessment by a qualified Treatment Director and identified needs will be addressed in the youth's treatment plan. We currently do not have a full-time therapist, but we are contracting with Brighter Futures, who provide TF-CBT. Our part-time therapist does family sessions, as well as works with severe issues including eating disorders, sexualized behavior and self-harming behaviors.

Psychiatric services are offered to each client admitted to the program. Clients are placed on a waiting list upon admission and are scheduled for the first available appointment. Youth's are typically seen within 30 days of admission. Our full-time therapist does family therapy sessions, as well as sibling sessions. Our part time therapist specializes in more severe issues, such as eating disorders, sexual acting out, processing sexual abuse and behavior disorders.
