Benchmark Family Services provides quality services including therapeutic case management through weekly contact and monthly home visits, and twenty-four hour crisis intervention. We also offer continuity of care through inclusive in-office therapeutic services including individual psychotherapy and psychiatry, as well as medication management. Our goal is to provide stable placements for youth when entering our agency and we strive to have an 80% favorable discharge rate each month. In consideration of this goal, we focus our efforts on placement preservation through the prevention unnecessary moves and disruption of youth through providing additional support within the home as needed. Benchmark maintains a close working relationship with DCBS through detailed documentation each month in regards to the children's progress towards goals and overall wellbeing. Upon placement with our agency, each youth receives a thorough psycho-social assessment by our Treatment Director which culminates in a comprehensive treatment plan to address any significant issues of concern. We employ two therapists that specialize in Cognitive Behavior Therapy, Trauma Focused-Cognitive Behavior Therapy, and Motivational Interviewing. Additionally, each individual clinician has their own set of specialized domains from which they utilize skills such as Dialectical

Foster children are encouraged to remain in contact with their parents. Family therapy is available as requested by DCBS.
