Benchmark Family Services provides quality services including therapeutic case management services, 24 hour crisis intervention, and mental health treatment with a contracted psychiatrist and on staff therapists. We have weekly case management, bi-weekly therapy, group therapy, monthly team meetings, access to psychiatry services as needed for medication management or stabilization, daily therapeutic foster care and independent living skills for ages 12 and older. Our goal is to provide stable and consistent placements to youth in care and will work with DCBS to prevent disruptions or unnecessary moves for children in care. Case managers provide detailed monthly Treatment Status Reports to the referring agency and include the referring agency in all treatment planning meetings. Each youth placed will complete a thorough psycho-social assessment by a qualified Treatment Director and identified needs will be addressed in the youth's treatment plan. Benchmark Family Services accepts referrals for placements twenty four hours a day, seven days a week.

Foster children are encouraged to remain in contact with their parents. Family therapy is available upon request by DCBS.
