**Supplemental Information**

BGH case managers work with youth to assess their independent living skills needs and develop individualized treatment plans to work on increasing those skills. Case managers have a minimum of weekly face to face contact with the young adult and provide 24-hour crisis support. Case managers support with making medical appointments and applying for educational and job opportunities. They will assist young adults by transporting to appointments or working with them to obtain transportation as necessary. BGH provides the young adult with a weekly allowance for groceries and personal care items, in addition BGH assist the them by saving money for them during their time in the program so when they exit the program or age out of care they are able to leave with money to assist them in securing living arrangements. All young adults levels 3-5 receive individual therapy at least two times per month. Young adults assigned levels 1-2 receive individual therapy as needed or requested. Family therapy is provided when appropriate. Other therapeutic interventions are available to meet the specific therapeutic needs of the young adult.

## Describe How the Program Supports Family Connections

BGH will work with our young adults to develop healthy relationships with an identified family member who is approved to have contact with the them. BGH recognizes the importance of continuing appropriate familial relationships while in the Independent Living Program; developing a support system is a necessary independent living skill. If it is assessed to be appropriate and the young adult agrees to participate BGH clinical staff will provide therapy to them and the family member to ensure appropriate family connection and support.

## Special Interventions Available Internally

Supervised ILP provides intensive life skills training including hand over hand assistance to prepare for transition to IL. We offer therapeutic interventions including substance abuse services, JSO counseling and equine-assisted therapy. Residents participate targeted life skills education, vocational training and job placement services. Case managers assess needs and develop individualized treatment plans to improve those skills. They have weekly face to face contact, provide 24-hour crisis support, assist with scheduling appointments and applying for educational and job opportunities. They will assist with transportation as necessary. Youth receive a weekly allowance for groceries and personal care items, in addition we assist the youth by saving money for them so they leave with money to assist in securing living arrangements. Family therapy is provided when appropriate.
