Communication is encouraged as part of treatment, weekly telephone calls provided, weekly on campus visits encouraged, staff provide transportation to visits, and families are invited to attend treatment conferences or to join via conference call when available. Family therapy provided when appropriate.

Special Interventions Available Internally

Program serves males ages 12-20. Pshchiatric Nurse Practitioner is available for consultation as needed. Program has a full time RN, who is available after hours as needed. All clinical staff have been trained in seven challenges program for substance abuse treatment. Clinical staff also provide treatment for sexually reactive behaviors. All staff are trained in first aid and CPR.
