On-going psychiatric services are provided to clients that present with issues surrounding mental health needs and/or psychotropic medication management. Urgent psychiatric services are available to address pressing issues, and for client's requiring services during non business hours and weekends. We also have 24 hour access to mobile crisis team services should a child present as a danger to self/others.
