Hope Hill's therapeutic foster care program provides services for youth with a wide variety of issues and needs including youth with sexual and physical abuse and neglect histories. We provide Smart recovery for substance abuse. Our individual therapy consists of motivational interviewing, anger replacement therapy, cognitive-behavioral therapy, and trauma focused behavioral therapy. Hope Hill's therapeutic foster care provides 24/7 hour crisis intervention.
