Independent Living clients are given the opportunity to obtain their GED or diploma, enroll in college full time or part time, or work full time or part time. All ILP clients will be provided with at minimum weekly case management services, peer support services, therapeutic services, and psychiatric services, which are offered in their home. Our clients are assisted in building independent living skills that include but are not limited to budgeting, grocery shopping, cooking, employment skills, parenting skills if necessary, and health and wellness opportunities and maintenance. All clients also receive 24 hours crisis support.

Special Interventions Available Internally

Hope Hill's therapeutic foster care program provides services for youth with a wide variety of issues and needs including youth with sexual and physical abuse and neglect histories. Our individual therapy consists of motivational interviewing, anger replacement therapy, cognitive-behavioral therapy, and trauma focused behavioral therapy. Hope Hill's therapeutic foster care provides 24/7 hour crisis intervention. All services are in the youth's home.
