# Describe How the Program Supports Family Connections

Hope Hill's therapeutic foster care program supports family reunification by encouraging families to become involved in the treatment planning process and through individual and family therapy. We can also supervise therapeutic visits, if needed. Hope Hill's program facilitates regular communication between youth and family members, and assists with transportation of youth for visitations.

## Special Interventions Available Internally

Hope Hill's therapeutic foster care program provides services for youth with a wide variety of issues and needs including youth with sexual and physical abuse and neglect histories. We offer SMART Recovery for youth who have a history of substance misuse that can be provided. Our individual therapy consists of motivational interviewing, anger replacement therapy, cognitive-behavioral therapy, and trauma focused behavioral therapy. Hope Hill's therapeutic foster care provides 24/7 hour crisis intervention.
