Home visits, assistance with transportation to home visits as well as other financial assistance, i.e. hotels, food, gas assistance, and family sessions.

## Special Interventions Available Internally

Case management is available to all children in the program. There is 24 hour clinical on call coverage. Psychological evaluations are available through referrals to the outpatient clinic. Chemical dependency treatment is provided via individual therapy, as well as available through the outpatient clinics. Program therapist also provide TF-CBT for trauma therapy. School therapists, who are contracted through the school system, are available to children with targeted school behaviors. Groups are conducted in the group home on a weekly basis by members of the clinical staff.
