## Describe How the Program Supports Family Connections

Our agency strongly believes in involving a child's biological family in their treatment. Kulima Care provides an orientation to the child's biological family, according to what is specified in the court order and the child's plan of service. This orientation includes a discussion about foster care, the biological family's continuing involvement with the child, agency services, and a conversation about their rights and responsibilities while the child is in foster care. When indicated by the child's service plan, our agency also meets with the child's biological family face-to-face within the first month of placement. We continue to meet with the biological parents to assist the family in achieving their goals and increase their preparedness for reunification.

## Special Interventions Available Internally

Kulima Care is passionate about serving families, whether biological, foster, or adoptive, as we believe that the foundation of our work with children and youth begins in the home. Therefore, providing an abundance of support to caregivers is our priority. Our agency is committed to finding and training qualified foster and adoptive parents to ensure stable and safe placements for our clients. Our staff provides case management, clinical support, parent training, and 24-hour crisis support.
