In most cases these youth have no viable biological home or family supports to fall back on when times get tough. For these youth a positive start to life on their own is absolutely ESSENTIAL to a positive life outcome. Our program seeks to empower young people by helping them help themselves. Our program focuses on focuses on skills that promote self-reliance, good citizenship, responsibility, and self-esteem. We will accept youth that do not have a high school diploma or GED (we will assist the youth with obtaining once in our program). All IL staff have been trained to complete the ASAP suicide assessment All therapeutic staff can complete substance abuse (PADDI-5) and domestic violence assessments for IL youth as well as offer C.A.R.E skill training (Child-Adult Relationship Enhancement skills building).
