We serve a wide range of youth populations including the most difficult children and those with a history of severe mental health issues and/or criminally delinquent behaviors. Our highly trained counselors, clinicians and therapists work alongside case managers, state workers, foster parents, and other stakeholders to provide quality services that include goal-directed, psychosocial treatment and support to youth and their families. We also specialize in crisis interventions, family group decision making and critical stress debriefing.
