Psychiatric Services

All youth receive a mental health screening upon intake to assess for any urgent mental health needs or potential referrals. The youth is referred to a community contracted psychiatrist depending on the foster home location. Referrals are made as quickly as possible of placement to ensure that the youth can receive services within 30-45 day time frame. Necco will communicate with the previous psychiatric provider for refills until the youth can be seen. Foster parents are trained in Necco's internal medication management curriculum. Necco staff monitor and support the youth and foster parent to ensure that medication management and documentation are consistent.

Describe How the Program Supports Family Connections

Staff members and foster families are provided continuous training about partnering with biological family members to realize the goal of reunification. Necco provides transportation to biological family visits and monitors the frequency and appropriateness of approved family contacts. In addition, biological family members are encouraged to participate in their child's Comprehensive Treatment Planning. Family therapy is offered to promote healthy attachment and ease the child's transition back into the home.

Special Interventions Available Internally

In addition to weekly case management services, treatment planning and 24-hour crisis support Necco provides a wide range of specialized therapy interventions. Our highly trained counselors, clinicians and therapists work alongside case managers, state workers, foster parents, and other stakeholders to provide quality services that include goal-directed, psychosocial treatment and support to youth and their families. For the Louisville, KY location, specialized interventions available internally include: crisis interventions, random drug screens, working with youth victims of domestic and family violence, sexual abuse victims, substance abuse, reactive attachment disorder, family group decision making and critical stress debriefing, case management, PTSD, ADHD, conduct disorder, ODD, depression and other mood disorders, psycho-educational training available to foster parents as needed, self-harm and self-mutilation.
