NECCO Lexington's Independent Living program is designed to provide support to 18 to 21 year old's who have made the decision to extend their commitment with the state. IL client's must be obtaining their GED or high school diploma, be enrolled in college full time, working full time, or going to school part time and working part time. Our apartment are located close to the bus line for the purposes of accessing community resources such as education, employment, medical facilities, etc. Currently, we have apartments located in Richmond and Lexington. Youth will receive weekly case management which includes discussing education, employment IL skills, health and wellness, permanency, and parenting skills if applicable. All clients will have access to 24 hour crisis support, and local psychiatric providers can be assessed by youth if medication management or evaluation is needed. Therapeutic services are also offered through NECCO. We will accept youth that do not have a high school diploma or GED (we will assist the youth with obtaining once in our program). All IL staff have been trained to complete the ASAP suicide assessment All therapeutic staff can complete substance abuse (PADDI-5) and domestic violence assessments for IL vouth as well as offer C.A.R.F. skill training (Child-Adult, Relationshin Enhancement skills huilding)
