Necco Louisville's ILP provides the highest quality in home case management services and therapeutic support for the IL youth we serve. Our staff hold advanced degrees in social work, psychology, and counseling. Necco Louisville provides each IL youth with a fully furnished safe apartment. The youth receives monthly stipends for food, transportation, phone/wifi, and other living expenses. Our services include weekly case management, 24-hour crisis support, mental health treatment, and ongoing basic living skill development. We will accept youth that do not have a high school diploma or GED (we will assist the youth with obtaining once in our program). All IL staff have been trained to complete the ASAP suicide assessment All therapeutic staff can complete substance abuse (PADDI-5) and domestic violence assessments for IL youth as well as offer C.A.R.E skill training (Child-Adult Relationship Enhancement skills building).

Our highly trained counselors, clinicians and therapists work alongside case managers, state workers, foster parents, and other stakeholders to provide quality services that include goal-directed, psychosocial treatment and support to youth and their families. We also specialize in crisis interventions, family group decision making and critical stress debriefing.
