Necco - Owensboro's ILP has apartments in Owensboro and Henderson that are fully furnished. The Necco - Owensboro's ILP program offers weekly case management contact, monthly educational groups (including health issues, relationship issues, and common daily living task), mental health services (including initial screenings and weekly/bi-weekly therapy, individual and/or family counseling if needed), school contacts (including assistance with registration and tutoring services), random drug testing (if requested) and 24 hour on call crisis intervention. If youth complete the program successfully, they have the option of remaining in the apartment (approved by landlord) and keeping all its contents. If youth chooses to leave (and has successfully completed the program), they may keep all contents of the apartment and take with them. We will accept youth that do not have a high school diploma or GED (we will assist the youth with obtaining once in our program). All IL staff have been trained to complete the ASAP suicide assessment All therapeutic staff can complete substance abuse (PADDI-5) and domestic violence assessments for IL youth as well as offer C.A.R.E skill training (Child-Adult Relationship Enhancement skills building).

**Psychiatric Services**

All ILP youth receive a mental health screening at intake to address any immediate psychiatric issues. ILP youth with presenting issues or needing continuation of medication management are referred to a contracted community psychiatric provider. First appointments are usually achieved in less than 30 days. ILP youth are given the option of providers in order for them to be an active participant in their mental health/health services. ILP staff work with the youth to ensure appointment follow-up and compliance with the prescribed medication.
