The staff at Necco Paducah have a wealth of experience working with youth needing to focus on increasing and improving independent living skills including but not limited to achieving academic goals, obtaining and maintaining employment, creating and following a budget, completing household chores, instilling responsibility, empowering confidence and enhancing their ability to succeed. Necco Paducah provides furnished apartments in three different locations. Each apartment is close to a college campus, food/store, and employment opportunities. We meet the youth regularly, facilitate meetings with mentors, and schedule monthly group sessions teaching independent living skills, and creating a support system for the youth. Qualified mental health providers are on staff for therapy services when needed and requested. We will accept youth that do not have a high school diploma or GED (we will assist the youth with obtaining once in our program). All IL staff have been trained to complete the ASAP suicide assessment All therapeutic staff can complete substance abuse (PADDI-5) and domestic violence assessments for IL youth as well as offer C.A.R.E skill training (Child-Adult Relationship Enhancement skills building)

All ILP youth receive a mental health screening upon intake to assess for any urgent mental health needs or potential referrals. Necco ILP staff coordinates with local physicians and psychiatrists to provide medication management services for the ILP youth we serve. ILP youth are typically seen for medication management services within the first thirty days of placement and/or when their current prescription requires an appointment for medication monitoring or assessing. ILP staff work with the ILP youth to ensure independence and responsibility in medication management.
