We work with state workers, foster parents and family members to provide face-to-face bio family visits (supervised and unsupervised as ordered), telephone contact and home visits (as allowed). The youth's treatment plan includes (as individualized to need and circumstances) goals and objectives related to strengthening bonds with family and other pro-social adults. Family counseling is provided as indicated by each youth's treatment plan to work toward family reunification as appropriate.

Family counseling is provided as indicated by each youth's treatment plan."
