New Hope, Inc. invites all stakeholders to attend all treatment planning meetings, case conferences; Foster parents & staff have provided transportation to families in need. New Hope, Inc. supports the idea of Family to Family conferences, while participting in CHFS 5 day treatment planning meetings when appropriate and will assist in assuring that natural family participates in the child's treatment when deemed appropriate by CHFS. This agency often encourages on site supervised family visits for the natural families. We encourage all siblings visits and family visits when allowed.

Special Interventions Available Internally

New Hope TFC Inc.will provide in home theraputic services as needed. Services in each foster home setting are monitored by direct service staff and supported by 24/7 on call response. During the Covid Crisis we added tela health to help youth transition. Agency staff continue to work to meet the childs needs on an individual basis.
