Our goal is to "do whatever it takes" to provide stable placements to youth while partnering with DCBS and other community partners to prevent disruptions or unnecessary moves for children. Our Foster Parents are equipped with evidenced based de-escalation techniques such as Together Facing the Challenge to promote healing so our children can reach their fullest potential. At Omni, we deliver results by utilizing the youth's strengths while nurturing their needs. We accept referrals 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.

Omni Visions utilizes our sister branch Omni Community Health therapists and contracts psychiatrists, pediatricians and/or nurse practitioners to meet the therapeutic and medication management needs of youth placed in our care. We also have partnerships with tele-psychiatry providers who are affiliated with Child and Adolescent Crisis Stabilization units to ensure safety whenever the need arises. We have access to emergency appointments whenever necessary, but strive to secure psychiatric services within the first 30-45 days of placement.

Omni Provides Evidence-Based Programming Structured Analysis Family Evaluation (SAFE). SAFE is a comprehensive, best practice home study methodology used to evaluate families for adoption and foster care. It was developed by the California Consortium for Children and is currently used in 15 states. Child and Adolescent Needs And Strengths (CANS). CANS is a clinician-rated assessment tool that is strength based, culturally responsive, and family focused. It is currently being used statewide in 16 states and has a presence in an additional 22. Together Facing the Challenge (TFC). This program was developed at Duke University Medical Center's Department of Services Effectiveness Research Program. TFC has been rated as an evidence based practice by the California Evidence-Based Clearinghouse for Child Welfare.
