It was developed by the California Consortium for Children and is currently used in 15 states. Child and Adolescent Needs And Strengths (CANS). CANS is a clinician-rated assessment tool that is strength based, culturally responsive, and family focused. It is currently being used statewide in 16 states and has a presence in an additional 22. Together Facing the Challenge (TFC). This program was developed at Duke University Medical Center's Department of Services Effectiveness Research Program. TFC has been rated as an evidence based practice by the California Evidence-Based Clearinghouse for Child Welfare.
