RE employs two Psychiatric Nurse Practitioners who services all RESTEP clients needing medication management. The provider is available at all times to assess the efficacy of the psychotropic medication and to provide feedback of potential side effects. The provider meets with each client, biological family (when available), SSW (when available), and their treatment staff to provide a more thorough evaluation to ensure appropriate medications are prescribed. Our provider also assists with after-care referrals and prescriptions to ensure a smooth transition and no lapse in medication.

Describe How the Program Supports Family Connections

RE arranges visitation and provides transportation for youth visits, if needed, as approved by worker; Telephone contact, visits and family counseling are encouraged and available; Family is encouraged to be involved in informing the Comprehensive Assessment, treatment plan development and implementation; RE supports case plans developed by DCBS worker and participates fully in planning and transition services. RE staff provides coaching and modeling to parents when applicable. RE also supervises visitation when appropriate. When reunification occurs, RE will make referrals to appropriate local resources to follow up with ongoing individual and family therapy..

Special Interventions Available Internally

Ramey-Estep (RE) provides crisis intervention by RESTEP staff; educational support services by case management and clinical staff; RESTEP case managers will be trained in CARE Model. Several REH-TFC Therapists have been trained in Yoga for Resilience, Strengthening Families, PCIT, Play Therapy, AutPlay, Family Therapy, Motivational Interviewing, Emotionally Focused Family Therapy, DBT, EMDR and TF-CBT. All RESTEP staff are trained in JKM Safe Crisis Management. Designated as a QRTP for human trafficking and parenting teens.
