SAFY is accredited by the Council on Accreditation (COA). We currently provide a scattered site Independent Living program for youth 18 to 21-years-old. SAFY services include: weekly case management home visits, therapy as requested by the youth, referrals for medication management as needed, assistance navigating post-secondary education, job readiness and retention skills, and money management skills. SAFY also includes a 24/7 crisis support service to assist youth in need. SAFY promotes healthy connections and communication with youth's biological families and other members of youth's circle of support.

Describe How the Program Supports Family Connections

While none of the youth in the Independent Living program have a goal of reunification, SAFY works with youth to create healthy boundaries and relationships with their biological families. SAFY works to promote healthy attachments between youth and their biological family as well as works to educate youth on the signs of unhealthy relationships that could arise between themselves and family members in the future. SAFY provides biological family with support services, including outpatient counseling and skill development if needed.

Special Interventions Available Internally

SAFY provides 24/7 crisis support and in-home case management. SAFY Case Coordinators are trained in working with youth who have experienced trauma, abuse, and neglect and how these experiences can affect their needs as they live independently. SAFY Therapists are licensed, Master's level staff specializing in sexual abuse, substance abuse, and disorders common to abused/neglected children, and utilize evidence based methods. Therapists are trained in TF-CBT and Seven Challenges.
