We provide the highest level of therapeutic support for the children and families we serve. SAFY is accredited by the Council on Accreditation (COA). We currently provide treatment foster care placements for children from birth to 21-years-old. SAFY services include: Licensed, Master's level therapist assigned to each client with weekly contact for treatment integration. All therapists are trained in TF-CBT and Seven Challenges. In-home therapy for each client. 24.7 Crisis support and 24.7 referral acceptance/intake. Biological family therapy to aid in reunification. Independent Living program. Specialized homes: pre-IL, teen parent, large sibling groups, medically fragile, foster to adopt. Each foster parent trained in UKERU (crisis Intervention) to de-escalate and manage crisis without physical restraints. Detailed monthly reports

Describe How the Program Supports Family Connections

SAFY encourages biological family members to participate in the youth's treatment planning. Family therapy is offered to promote healthy attachment and ease the child's transition back into the home. SAFY provides biological family with support services, including counseling, coordination of community resources, advocacy, and skill development and parenting training. Foster families are provided continuous training about partnering with biological family members to realize the goal of reunification.

Special Interventions Available Internally

SAFY provides 24/7 support and in-home therapy. SAFY therapists are licensed, Master's level therapists specializing in sexual abuse, substance abuse, and disorders common to abused/neglected children, and utilize evidence based methods. Therapists are trained in TF-CBT and Seven Challenges. Foster parents receive mandatory Trauma Informed Parenting, Alcohol and Drug, Behavior Management, and UKERU crisis intervention training.
