**Supplemental Information**

Sunrise Eastern Mountain Region has been licensed since 1995 and has served hundreds of children in its history. What began as one region has become two different regions of foster care for Sunrise due to its growth, including programs in Morehead and Pikeville. It is just one part of a comprehensive continuum of care that includes after care planning and is focused on our clients and their families. Our program is licensed to serve the populations of foster care, therapeutic foster care, medically fragile, and foster-to-adopt, and we have specialized homes for parenting teens, large sibling groups, clients over the age of 18, and lower functioning children. Our program trains the entire treatment team in the Positive Discipline evidence-based practice model we use and specializes in the individualized treatment approach that every client deserves. Our success is seen in the credentials and experience of our staff, the longevity of our foster parents, and the number of clients who have found forever homes (over 300 clients have been adopted in the last three years) through our foster-to-adopt emphasis across the Commonwealth.

## Describe How the Program Supports Family Connections

The support of a family connection is something we strive for in every client's life, and permanency is addressed from the minute a client is referred and admitted to our program. Our team works directly with the biological family whenever possible to receive their input and include them in the progress/treatment of the child, thus making that a vital part of the client's care. When families need our assistance, we work with them through flexible scheduling, internet facilitated meetings/visits, family therapy, phone care assistance, supervised visitation, transportation, and other creative means of support.

## Special Interventions Available Internally

Staff is actively involved with our foster families and available to the treatment team members 24/7/365. Our staff members have detailed experience in therapeutic foster care, family preservation/reunification, residential, DCBS, psychiatric hospitalization, school-based counseling, clinical out-patient clinics, and working with biological family. We fully focus on the clients and families we serve. Our agency support of our homes includes providing furniture, specialized equipment, electronic supervision, financial and physical support, and even daycare expenses in order to place a child or sibling group, and we will do whatever is possible to maintain placements and prevent disruptions. We typically have several children in care at any given time that we have helped to finish their high school education, get part-time jobs, and further their education in local colleges and technical schools, as they advance towards the completion of independent living goals.
