The Sunrise Scattered Site Independent Living Services Program/Venture On program is a part of the Sunrise continuum of care that focuses on helping young adults ages 18-21 successfully transition into adulthood. Our Independent Living program was named winner of the 2018 Aging Out Institute National Awards Program for its strategies in supporting youth after they age out of foster care, specifically helping them be successful with finding & keeping stable employment. Monthly benefits are up to \$1450.00. In addition a \$100.00 monthly stipend, clients receive the following: paid lease and utilities, up to an additional \$250.00 monthly to offset food, household expenses, work & educational expenses, monthly bus route tokens, an opportunity to earn an additional \$250.00 quarterly & professionally facilitated IL skills class groups. Assistance with transportation may include grocery trips, appointments, etc

Describe How the Program Supports Family Connections

Clients in the Independent living program have already reached adulthood and are living independently from family members. Clients are encouraged to maintain healthy family contacts throughout their stay in the IL program. Program staff encourage client's to invite parents and other significant family members to treatment meetings and as a part of their support system. Family members are not allowed to live with clients in their apartment'; however with staff permission they are allowed to visit overnight occasionally.

Special Interventions Available Internally

Staff longevity and a variety of trained individuals whose main goal is to ensure that clients become productive members of the community. A licensed program therapist is available upon client request. The program provides 24/7 emergency on call system for all clients.
