# Describe How the Program Supports Family Connections

The support of a Family Connection is something we strive for in every client's life and permanency is addressed from the minute a client is referred and admitted to our program. Our team works directly with the biological family whenever possible to receive their input and include them in the progress/treatment of the child, thus making that a vital part of the client's care. When families need our assistance, we work with them through flexible scheduling, internet facilitated meetings/visits, family therapy, phone card assistance, supervised visitation, transportation, and other creative means of support. It is a privilege to be a guest in a family's life and our staff expectation is to honor that privilege through respect of the family.

#### Special Interventions Available Internally

Sunrise team members are actively involved with our foster families and available to the treatment team members 24/7/365. Staff members have detailed experience in therapeutic foster care, family preservation/reunification, residential, DCBS, psychiatric hospitalization, and working with biological family and are fully focused on the clients and families we serve. Our agency support of our foster homes include providing furniture such as twin beds, mattresses and cribs, specialized equipment, financial and physical support, and assistance with daycare expenses on a case by case basis in order to place a child or sibling group and will do whatever it takes to keep a client in the home so the placement is not disrupted. Sunrise can further provide a continuum of care through our state wide Independent Living programs designed for young adults ages 18 to 21
