Supplemental Information

Benchmark Family Services provides quality services including therapeutic case management services, 24 hours crisis intervention, along with mental health treatment with independent psychiatrists and an on staff therapist. Our therapist is also certified in TF-CBT. Each therapeutic foster child receives therapeutic services twice monthly or more often as needed with the on-site therapist. Each youth has completed a thorough psycho-social assessment by a qualified Treatment Director and identified needs are addressed in the youth's treatment plan. The Therapeutic Support Specialist assigned to the foster home provides monthly Treatment Status Reports to the referring agencies, and includes them on all treatment plan meetings. Each child receives case management services once weekly, or more often as needed. Benchmark Family Services' Therapeutic Support Specialist will also provide the foster family with a minimum of two therapeutic home visits and one out of home visit per month. Benchmark Family Services has a 24 hours emergency phone available at all times for foster parents and youth to contact a staff member directly for assistance. Specialized trainings are provided for the foster parents as needed as well. Safety plans are developed at placement when needed as well, which also includes sexual safety plans when
