## Describe How the Program Supports Family Connections

CHNK actively promotes family reintegration whenever possible. Families are invited and encouraged to participate in Family Therapy, treatment team and ARC meetings, visits with their child and to a maintain telephone contact to the greatest extent possible. When reunification is not possible, CHNK collaborates with DCBS and other agencies to identify appropriate alternatives, and the provision of family treatment to assist children moving into foster or pre-adoptive homes.

## Special Interventions Available Internally

Day Treatment (Outpatient) services are secured for residents meeting medical necessity and upon MCO approval. This combination of residential and day treatment services appropriately increases the type and number of clinical services needed to advance achievement of treatment goals, reduce length of stay and mitigate recidivism. Psychiatric Residential Treatment Facility (PRTF) services are also available to DCBS youth meeting medical necessity and upon MCO approval. CHNK works to obtain authorization of services, and for a smooth transition make into PCC care as needed.
