We assist with transport when possible, and that assistance might include a gas card to allow family participation in treatment. Family sessions can be scheduled in a manner convenient to family members, including by phone.

## Special Interventions Available Internally

MET/CBT techniques are currently offered to address substance use issues for residential clients. Specialty groups are offered when the need and census can support such groups. The most recent groups have included grief and loss as well as groups focused on trauma related issues. TF-CBT and EMDR are available as appropriate.
