KVC works closely with DCBS and honors requests to provide family therapy with the biological family and or the foster family geared towards reunification. KVC encourages participation of the biological family in treatment planning at the direction of DCBS.

## Special Interventions Available Internally

KVC provides psychological testing (Vineland Adaptive Behavior Scales) for further assessment and identification of social skills and personal skills. Identification and Assessment of Autism Spectrum Issues Training was provided to staff on identification and assessment of autism spectrum disorders by Dr. Myra Beth Bundy. Trained staff assess, identify and refer to specialized applied behavioral analysis treatment providers. Our clinical staff is available to respond and react to crisis and emergency situations 24/7.
