## Describe How the Program Supports Family Connections

Key Assets involves families in the treatment of the youth in our care to the fullest extent possible. Specifically, when deemed appropriate by DCBS, we invite families to be active participants in our Key Care/Treatment Planning meetings. Key Assets provides multiple opportunities for communication via phone/FaceTime, Skype and on-site visits in addition to providing transportation to visits and supervise visits as needed.

## Special Interventions Available Internally

Individual and group therapy is available and provided by Qualified Mental Health Professionals. Key Assets also contracts for ABA services. ABA providers complete Functional Assessments which are then used to develop and help the group home staff implement Positive Behavior Support Plans. Once the plan is implemented ABA providers continue to provide support and training to the youth and group home staff to help youth reach their goals. All direct care staff are trained and certified as Community Support Associates (CSA). Youth who qualify for Speech/Language and Occupational Therapy will be referred for these services. Key Assets has employed a Nurse Coordinator/RN and two medical assistants who oversees medical appointments and issues related to medication management. Key Assets Kentucky is working with the University of Louisville to complete an agency-wide assessment with the focus of becoming a Trauma Informed Agency.
