The program has specialized dorm settings for those with chemical dependency issues, those who have sexual behavior problems, those whose primary treatment concern is aggression and those who are lower functioning. Clients attend school on-site. All clients are assigned a Masters level Treatment Supervisor who provides clinical services and Care Coordinator who provides case management services. The program has fully implemented a trauma-informed care approach, Risking Connection. Lastly, the program has fully implemented the Seven Challenges model for substance abuse treatment.

Psychiatric Services

Maryhurst has a contract with Dr. Alphonso Nichols to provide psychiatric care for our youth. The psychiatrist is on campus each week and is available by phone for emergencies 24 hour/day seven days per week basis. Typically a newly admitted youth sees the psychiatrist within the week after admission, but no longer than two weeks after admission. The psychiatrist meets with members of the treatment team each month and is available for consultation on an as needed basis.

Describe How the Program Supports Family Connections

Family therapy is provided internally, at times through speaker phone or a secured teleconferencing site if the family does not have the resources to come on-site. Families are involved in treatment planning. Staff assist with transportation to visits as needed.

Special Interventions Available Internally

The program routinely is offering music and art therapy, as well as life-skills training and wellness/activity programming. The Euphrasia staff have been trained and have fully implemented the Seven Challenges approach to substance abuse treatment. Madeline's Cottage is equipped to serve lower functioning youth. The program has access to Occupational Therapy and Behavior Analyst interventions as needed.
