## Describe How the Program Supports Family Connections

Rosehaven staff assist with transportation to family visits as needed. Families are involved in treatment planning and are encouraged to visit on-site. Treatment Supervisor works closely with families in arranging home passes, visits, contact, etc.

## Special Interventions Available Internally

The program staff have been trained and utilize the Seven Challenges approach for substance abuse treatment. Clients attend community AA/NA meetings. Clients attend public school, but program staff work with all public schools to ensure client success. Rosehaven staff are also able to help youth gain the necessary pre-independent living skills that are needed as they approach independence. Transitional living staff also provide programming for those youth who have completed high school and are enrolling in college.
