Necco Lexington provides youth and foster parents with weekly case management and therapeutic support to stabilize placements. Our services include Weekly Intensive Case Management, Comprehensive Treatment planning, 24-hour on call crisis support, Individual, family, and group therapy, Independent Living Programming, Detailed Monthly Reports to Referring Agencies and 24-hour response on all referrals. We provide continuous training opportunities for our parents on topics such as trauma informed care, Behavior Management, De-escalation, Policy/Procedure, Cultural Diversity, Independent Living and needs identified by the individual youth's assessment. We have well trained staff with advanced degrees in social work, human services, child development, and psychology. We strive to take the best possible care of the people we serve and those who serve them. Our approach to supporting youth and families is grounded in the twelve principles of Re-education and five premises set forth by Nicholas Hobbs.

**Psychiatric Services**

A majority of youth entering care with Necco are on psychotropic medications and need continued access to a psychiatrist to ensure there is no lapse in medication management. Within the Lexington area, we have identified 3 psychiatrist that are accepting new patients and are Medicaid providers. Two of these provides are resident physicians at a local behavioral health acute care hospital as well which helps to facilitate transitions if a child is in need of psychiatric hospitalization and follow-up appointments. Typically a child is able to get an psychiatric assessment within 4 weeks of placement. As we do use these providers frequently, we can sometimes get an earlier appointment if it is a necessity. In addition we contract with a psychiatric nurse practitioner from an acute inpatient facility and can obtain an assessment within 2-3 weeks.

## Describe How the Program Supports Family Connections

Necco provides transportation for visits, Phone Contact, supervises visits as needed, invites parents to Comprehensive Treatment meetings, provides Family Therapy when appropriate to support reunification, and educates foster parents on building relationships with biological families, and the importance of visitation.

## Special Interventions Available Internally

Necco provides individual therapy, family therapy, and Group therapy. We have an on-call system available 24 hours for Crisis intervention. Licensed therapists utilize evidence-based practices such as Cognitive Behavioral Therapy, Motivational Interviewing, Trauma Focused Behavioral Therapy, and Play Therapy techniques. These modalities are utilized to assist with common diagnoses found in foster care such as PTSD, Anxiety Disorder, Depression Disorder, ADHD, RAD, ODD, Contact Disorder, and Adjustment Disorder. Necco utilizes trauma informed care during interventions and preservation to assist clients. In addition to therapy, Necco provides weekly case management and 24-hour crisis support to assist with interventions.
