Supplemental Information

NECCO Hazard ILP provides youth with apartments in close proximity to community resources as well as the office for additional support. Youth are provided with transportation assistance and given substantial food stipends twice per month. For mental health support program participants are encouraged to attend individual counseling. To encourage Independent Skill development we invite community partners such as attorneys, nurses, and chefs etc to speak to our youth. We also encourage our program participants to partake in one organized community service event per quarter for IL skill development. Youth are provided opportunities to maintain DCBS educational expectations through community educational opportunities. Youth are also given independent living skill challenges as a means to encourage skill development. We will accept youth that do not have a high school diploma or GED (we will assist the youth with obtaining once in our program). All IL staff have been trained to complete the ASAP suicide assessment. All therapeutic staff can complete substance abuse (PADDI-5) and domestic violence assessments for IL youth as well as offer C.A.R.E skill training (Child-Adult Relationship Enhancement skills building).

Psychiatric Services

All ILP youth receive a mental health screening at intake to address any immediate psychiatric issues and to screen for potential referrals. ILP youth with presenting issues or needing continuation of medication management are referred to a contracted community psychiatric provider. First appointments are usually achieved in less than 30 days. ILP youth are given the option of providers in order for them to be an active participant in their mental health/health services. ILP staff work with the youth to ensure appointment follow-up and compliance with the prescribed medication.

Describe How the Program Supports Family Connections

At Necco . . . We Build Families! We know the Power of Family and we work with each youth to strengthen family bonds and connections. Each youth has a permanency goal as part of their individualized treatment plan. Not all youth are able to return to their bio parents or even a bio family member home, but we seek to strengthen family bonds (parents, grandparents, siblings, aunts and uncles, cousins, etc.) whenever possible. We work with the youth's state worker, foster parents and family to provide face-to-face visits (supervised and unsupervised as ordered), telephone contact and home visits (as allowed). The youth's treatment plan includes (as individualized to need and circumstances) goals and objectives related to strengthening bonds with family and other pro-social adults. Family counseling is provided as indicated by each youth's treatment plan.

Special Interventions Available Internally

In addition to weekly case management services, treatment planning and 24-hour crisis support Necco provides a wide range of specialized therapy interventions. Our highly trained counselors, clinicians and therapists work alongside case managers, state workers, foster parents, and other stakeholders to provide quality services that include goal-directed, psychosocial treatment and support to youth and their families.
