Psychiatric Services

New Hope, Inc. has an on site clinical staff that includes a local psychiatrist. He is on property two days per week. He will assess the youth and see them ASAP. The doctor has admitting privileges at a local hospital. He follows children who are admitted to the hospital and will follow up upon discharge from the hospital. Upon intake, a child is assessed by a clinical team members. If a child is on prescribed medication, we often try to call upon the prescribing psychiatrist to get one refill in an effort to allow the agency psychiatrist time to secure blood work and EKG to establish a baseline for treatment. If needed, he will see children in need of medication in an emergency.

Describe How the Program Supports Family Connections

New Hope, Inc. invites all stakeholders to attend all treatment planning meetings, case conferences; Foster parents & staff have provided transportation to families in need. New Hope, Inc. supports the idea of Family to Family conferences, while participating in CHFS 5 day treatment planning meetings when appropriate and will assist in assuring that natural family participates in the child's treatment when deemed appropriate by CHFS. This agency often encourages on site supervised family visits for the natural families. We encourage all siblings visits and family visits when allowed.

Special Interventions Available Internally

New Hope TFC Inc. will provide in home therapeutic services as needed. Services in each foster home setting are monitored by direct service staff and supported by 24/7 on call response. During the Covid Crisis we added tele health to help youth transition. Agency staff continue to work to meet the child's needs on an individual basis.
