Stepstone Morehead is dedicated to impacting our community for the better with a mission to help foster youth. We currently provide therapeutic foster care for children and youth from birth to 20-years-old with homes in Morehead and several surrounding counties. Our professional staff provide weekly case management (with at least two face-to-face home visits per month), quarterly treatment planning, and 24/7 crisis intervention and foster parent support. Our youth receive individual therapy at least twice monthly as well as independent living skills development and constant support from members of our treatment team. Additional therapeutic services include family and sibling therapy and medication management is available if needed. Each foster parent is trained in managing difficult behaviors, medication administration and management, and maintaining biological family connections. Stepstone Morehead staff and foster parents work collaboratively with DCBS guardians, school staff, and other members of each youth's treatment team to stabilize placement, achieve treatment goals, and achieve permanency.

Foster parents are trained on safe medication administration and medication management. All children are seen within the first 30 days of admission if they are currently prescribed medication.

## Describe How the Program Supports Family Connections

StepStone Morehead actively works to involve biological families and support each youth's biological family connections. When at all possible, biological family members are included in treatment planning including treatment meetings and family/sibling therapy is available. Visitation arrangements are made within the first 30 days of admission for any youth with reunification as a goal and DCBS approval. Stepstone facilitates transportation for the youth in our care and provide transportation for visitation when necessary.

## Special Interventions Available Internally

StepStone Morehead's therapeutic foster care program provides 24/7 support services to foster youth and foster parents through case managers, treatment director, and a licensed therapist. All staff and foster parents are trained in trauma informed care and verbal de-escalation.
