Uspiritus Bellewood Bowling Green TFC provides quality services to all youth including: a continuum of care which provides stable and consistent placements; Family Preservation; Intensive In Home Services; Therapeutic Foster Care; Independent Living; Residential Private Child Care; Psychiatric Residential Treatment Facility; Therapeutic Case Management (minimum of two in home visits per month); 24 hour crisis intervention; monthly reports provided to the child's state worker; Independent Living Skills development. Detailed treatment planning is provided based on needs with quarterly treatment team meetings. Experienced Placement Team works to match the needs of the child to the appropriate family to prevent multiple placements, works across the state to minimize disruptions and accepts referrals for placements 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. Disruption prevention including monthly training for foster parents, Psycho-educational training for foster parents, Foster parent reimbursement for transportation to family visits, court and medical appointments, and Foster Parent support group also offered.

## Describe How the Program Supports Family Connections

Uspiritus Bellewood Bowling Green TFC supports family connections through regular contact between staff and family, facilitation of communication between child and family, transportation to family visits, family therapy as appropriate, inclusion of family of origin in child's treatment team. Uspiritus Bellewood Bowling Green TFC therapists, case managers and foster parents are trained to provide services related to: youth victims of family violence, Sexual offenders, Sexual abuse victims, Substance abuse, ADHD, Conduct Disorder, Mood disorders, PTSD, ODD, family group decision making, Depression, Self-harm, Reactive attachment disorder.

## Special Interventions Available Internally

Uspiritus TFC provides a continuum of quality services to help ensure children experience as few difficult transitions as possible. Uspiritus TFC also provides 24/7 support, weekly case management, and in house therapy. Uspiritus Bowling Green TFC has staff specializing in sexual abuse, substance abuse, and disorders common to abused/neglected children, and utilize evidence based methods. Foster parents receive psycho-educational training, ongoing monthly trainings, and clinical intervention from staff clinicians when needed. Uspiritus TFC works in collaboration with contracted psychiatrists and/or nurse practitioners for medication management. Uspiritus TFC therapists, case managers and foster parents are trained to provide services related to: youth victims of family violence, sexual offenders, sexual abuse victims, substance abuse, reactive attachment disorder, attention deficit disorder, conduct disorder, mood disorders, anxiety disorders, and other behavioral disorders.
